In this article, I will be addressing our branch's financial status. The BEC and branch officers have discussed our current financial

status in great detail. Here is where we are now and what we are facing down the line. The branch has several ongoing and fixed expenses, such as State SIR quarterly assessment, guests, speakers, birthday lunches, printing expenses, and recruiting expenses to name a few. In just this past year alone we have paid almost \$1,000 for guest lunches and about the same amount for the State assessment. Over the past 3 years our expenses have amounted to about \$2,500 per year. We were fortunate to have adequate reserves and were able to cover the costs during that time. We need to maintain a reserve so that we have enough cash on hand to pay for our monthly luncheons at the end of each meeting, in advance of any monies received. We also need cash on hand to pay for any expenses we need to advance, such as for the annual picnic or for any unexpected expense. (continued on page 2)

There will be some known and unknown increases in costs. The State has already raised their assessment fee. Bottom line, we have pretty much depleted our reserves.

All that said, I expect you have already guessed where I am going with all this. Given what I outlined in the preceding information, our financial reserves are at a point where we need to reinstate annual dues. Way back when we did assess dues, I believe it was in the range of \$20 or \$25? Our branch treasurer, Al Petrie, presented a detailed review of expense and income to the BEC and we have not yet decided on the exact amount. We do expect the amount will be within the above range. So, beginning in January 2023, we will, once again, be asking our members for annual dues. There will be more information in the December issue of the BARK as to the amount. Please feel free to reach out to the officers or other BEC members with any questions you may have.



Timothy Fawcett Badge #162

"Avoid telling me I can't do something until after I've done it!" Timothy Fawcett's story is one of determination, dedication, and a bit of good luck. He grew up in Wheeling, WV with his four older siblings in a 100-year-old house. He said he had a "Leave It to Beaver" family, with no drama and no tragedies. His dad followed in the footsteps of other medical professionals in the family and became an ophthalmologist. (Timothy had no

interest in such a career especially since it required taking standardized tests that he...ahem ...detested.) Timothy described his mom as a domestic goddess who stayed at home and raised kids. Both his mom and dad lived long lives, suggesting that their longevity genes live on in Timothy.



Military Institute (now called The Linsly School) for 5-12th grades. Several of the Fawcett men attended Linsly, a top private school in Wheeling with traditional values of hard work, respect, honor, honesty, and self-discipline. The school boasts of class sizes of 10 and a 100% college placement. Sure enough, Timothy graduated and went on to college for two years at West Virginia Wesleyan College where he got involved in their little 14K watt radio station. (Commercial radio stations typically broadcast at 50-100K watts.) Wanting to get more experience in telecommunications, Timothy transferred to Ohio University and earned a degree in radio and TV management administration. Despite failing the GMAT test to get in three times, he received an MBA at OU by proving himself a good student by maintaining high grades following a provisional acceptance. Confident in his ability to get a job in radio sales, Timothy moved to San Francisco with only a few bucks in pocket. Much to his distress, finding employment

took longer than expected. With no friends in the area, living in a Holiday Inn, and no cash in his wallet, he had serious thoughts about starvation. Miraculously, a credit card he applied for weeks before showed up in his mailbox that day! "Dinner is served!" he howled.

In 1983, getting work in radio in San Francisco was very competitive and almost exclusively for those with experience. Timothy started investigating smaller markets and interviewed with stations up in Sonoma County. He landed a job with an upstart country music station in Rohnert Park. Timothy's skill in sales paid off and the station started making profits quickly. Some of his success came from just dumb luck. While shopping in Costco, he and another guy were looking to buy the same ring. Timothy allowed the other guy to have it. With thanks, the guy handed Timothy a business card from a company Timothy was trying unsuccessfully to get to buy radio ad time. Following up a few days later with a phone call, Timothy asked the guy to help him get a meeting with the CEO of the company, after which they signed two-year deal! I guess success is both what you know and who you run in to at Costco.

On December 10, 2017, Timothy's life took a serious knock when he fell off a roof and severely iniured his head.

Timothy is a collector of over 7000 45rpm vinyl records. These sound great on the 25th Silver Anniversary Rock-Ola his dad gave him many years ago for his birthday. Timothy says the jukebox "thunders" when you turn it up! Timothy still has his first car, a 1972 Buick Grand Sport convertible V8 engine with less than 57,000 miles. The bad news, he groans, is that it gets six miles/gallon. Rich de Lambert introduced Timothy to SIR17 about 18 months ago. He didn't know anyone at first and was going to leave the club until he realized the terrific programs and activities the club offers. Now he claims he is in for life and eager to meet more guys! With in-person luncheons here again, our members will be glad to meet him too.

passed away on August 16, 2022. We send our condolences to his family.


Al was born in San Francisco on July 5, 1927.


